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People of every generation can relate to the universal themes of love, grief, trust and friendship. It's something about this type of storytelling that deeply moves us and withstands the test of time. In this season of Imaginary Theatre Company, we centered the concept and reality of friendship. What is friendship? Who are our real friends? What does it mean to be a friend in a time of isolation? What does friendship look like when so many of us feel distant, even isolated and unseen? There is something about friendship that grips me, now more than ever, and I explored it in the rehearsal room with the cast of this year's Tomás and the Library Lady. Both these stories, one that is a fable we have heard many times before and one that is an autobiography of a man many may not know, hold dear those universal ideas of love and grief, beautifully explore friendship, and unwrap all of its complexities, in under 50 minutes!

While filming these shows I was reminded of how important the need for love and friendship are, especially in a time when millions of people were quarantined away from the ones they loved the most. I must say, sharing space with colleagues and friends felt unusually special this past year, almost indelible and inspiring. We wore our masks and took every precaution, but we gathered in what felt like a sacred ritual to tell a story about friends and the most unlikely of pairs! Tomás and the Library Lady is a story about Tomás Rivera, the Mexican American immigrant who found a friend in the library lady, which led him to be a prolific writer, professor and advocate. Puss in Boots is a timeless story about finding a friend in the most unlikely of places, and discovering a life of joy, love and happiness.

I hope you grab a friend, a family member or a neighbor, whether they be near or far, whether they are down the street or overseas, and enjoy these shows with them. Watch them together. Share them with your friends and be grateful to engage, in a new way, with the relationships that bring out the best in us. I'd encourage all of us to watch these shows with young people we love. I'd encourage all of us to be grateful for the people we call friend and the ability to make new friends in unusual places. Maybe we all can learn a thing or two from a boy and his librarian, and a young man and his cat.


